Is There Help For Your Neuropathy?

Are you experiencing weakness or numbness in your hands and/or feet? The cause could be peripheral neuropathy. Other symptoms may include increased sensitivity to touch, decreased coordination, sharp "stab" like pains, burning and/or a feeling of a phantom cuff creating the sensation of wearing a glove or sock when there isn't one. These altered sensations can lead to secondary problems such as increased risk of falling, increased risk of burns, and potential worsening of symptoms up the progression of the nerve path.

Neuropathy is diagnosed as damage to the peripheral nervous system, typically in the hands and feet though it can occur in other areas of the body. If the nervous system damage progresses towards the core and central body, it can lead to more global nervous system issues such as difficulty with coordinating breathe, body temperature, and sweating. Neuropathy is often confused with radiculopathy which effects the nerve at the root, though the symptoms may travel to the furthest part of the extremities.

Causes of neuropathy are vast and varied. The two seen most in our clinic are from diabetes, and toxin/medicine induced via chemotherapy drugs. Other causes of peripheral neuropathy include injury, infection such as Lyme and Shingles, and autoimmune conditions such as Sjogren's and Lupus. No matter the reason, there are noninvasive, drug free options in physical therapy to address the issue. The majority of current treatment today involves medications that mask and lessen pain symptoms without addressing the lack of good blood supply in the effected area, all which carry a host of different unwanted side effects.

We have been featuring our Class IV laser in recent newsletters with great results for a variety of issues. We will be conducting another in- house study with emphasis on patients with neuropathy. Multiple studies show a positive effect on pain levels in those with neuropathy, especially if caused by diabetis. Why does it work so well? The laser stimulates cell growth, as well as a flooding of oxygen and blood supply to the area being treated. Because neuropathy directly correlates to lack of blood flow, the laser allows for the repair of nerve fibers and optimizes their function through increased oxygen, blood, and cellular health.

Interested in Class IV laser for *your* neuropathy? Be sure to take advantage of our in-house laser study and discounted laser package, which will be available from Jan. to March 2020! Participants will be scheduled either 2 or 3x/week for 15 sessions.
